

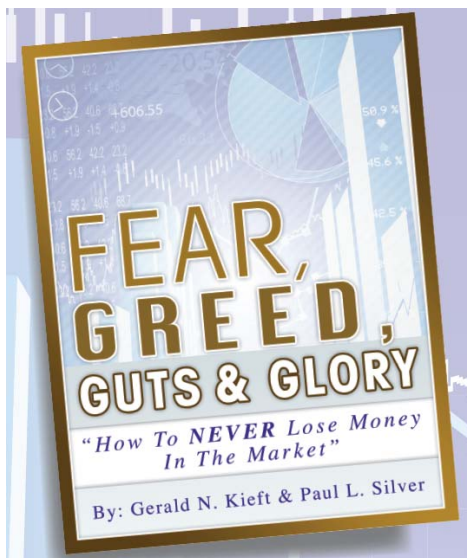

Alternative Investment Strategy to Increase Return and Reduce Risk

We recently published our first comprehensive investment guide titled *“Fear, Greed, Guts & Glory”*, subtitled *“How to NEVER Lose Money in the Market.”* The primary catalyst for this publication was to introduce investors to an alternative investment strategy that eliminates principal risk over your time horizon, while providing the opportunity for significant capital growth. The premise behind the philosophy is to combine “risk-free” investments with inflation protection assets as well as micro and small caps stocks to enhance returns while simultaneously reducing risk as measured by standard deviation (volatility). This methodology is critical to provide the emotional strength to stay the course when the equity markets fall significantly. Without the peace of mind provided by the principal protection, most investors get shaken out of the market at the wrong time.

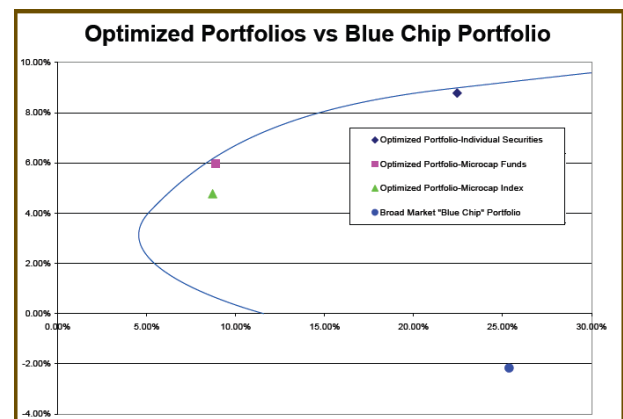


How do micro cap stocks fit into the equation? As small and micro cap specialists, we often hear people talk about how risky micro and small cap stocks are in comparison to mid-size and large cap stocks. Broadly speaking, equity investors assume that as market cap values increase, risk levels proportionally decrease. Therefore, one may think that owning the Dow Jones

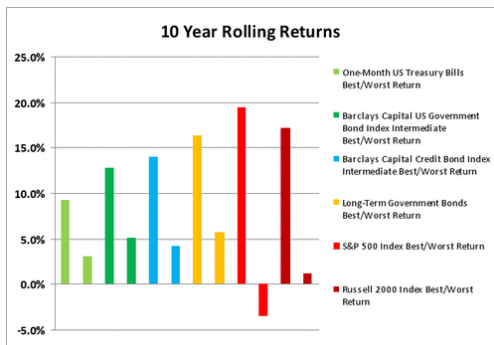
Industrial Average (DJIA) 30 is the safest allocation of equity capital available. As historical performance can attest, this widely held belief is simply not accurate. It is important to note that we are not trying to imply that all micro caps and all large caps share comparable risk levels. Our point is that a well diversified portfolio including small and micro capital companies has demonstrated higher returns and lower risk than large cap “blue chip” only portfolios. How can this be?

First, there is a broad misconception that investing in early stage companies has poor investment performance. The table on the following page clearly illustrates that even one of the most aggressive sectors of micro cap investing (venture capital) has outperformed the large cap market indices for **all** time periods over three years.

The graph below shows when small caps are combined with other types of asset categories, the outperformance is even greater. For the period 1998-2008, when combined with zero coupon bonds, gold, and oil (inflation hedge), \$100,000 grew to \$231,985, representing a CAGR of 8.8% with a standard deviation (risk) of 22.4% (shown as blue diamond on top right of chart below). This compares to a ten year performance using the DJIA (1/3 allocation), S&P 500 (1/3 allocation), and the NASDAQ (1/3 allocation) which returned a -2.2% CAGR with a 25.37% standard deviation (shown as the blue circle in the graph below).

 Note: Because the US Venture Capital index is cap weighted, the largest vintage years mainly drive the index's performance.

Notice that despite the enormous difference in performance between the two groups, risk in the large cap group was still HIGHER than the small cap group, meaning an investor assumed more risk for the “right” to lose 2.2% of his capital over ten years!

If readers are suspicious that this ten year period is a onetime statistical aberration, we can go back further in time and defend small cap performance. For the period January 1979-April 2009, on a ten year rolling return basis, the returns for the Russell 2000, an index that is the most common benchmark for mutual funds that identify themselves as “small cap”, have never been negative, which cannot be said for the S&P 500 returns, a large cap index.

Why are Micro and Small Cap stocks so often overlooked by retail investors as an attractive asset class?

First, there is no traditional analyst research coverage coupled with the penny stock rule that keeps the vast majority of brokers away from stocks trading under \$5.00 per share. Due largely to the lack of traditional analyst coverage, it is not easy to obtain information on micro to small capital companies so investors must dedicate a significant amount of time to analyze these companies. Because many investors do not have the time, discipline, experience or skills to perform proper analysis of these companies, those who do can gain a distinct advantage.

What can investors do?

First, read our investment guide (attachment below) to fully understand our perspective on smart investing in today’s volatile market. Companies included in WSR-Speculator are typically early stage or turnaround companies which are frequently WSR clients and (in our opinion) have the potential for a three hundred percent return over the next three to five years. Investors and analysts look to the buying and selling trends of insiders, who are typically long-term investors, for clues to the broader market outlook. According to Ben Silverman, InsiderScore.com's director of research, "Insiders have been very accurate in terms of calling market bottoms, both temporary, in terms of corrections, and troughs."

Although insider buying is a useful tool to consider when making a decision on which stock to buy, it should be looked at carefully lest it give a false positive signal. Investors need to look behind the headlines and conduct their own research before buying on this basis. For example, option exercises can also give false signals.

This section summarizes the companies (trading under \$5.00 per share) with the greatest amount of purchasing by insiders during the previous month.

The chart on the left illustrates the 4 and 13 week trailing average "Net Buying" in relationship to the entire market. In other words, what percent of the stocks in the entire market have net insider buying. In theory, the higher the percent the greater the indication that the overall market will increase in price.

FEBRUARY'S COMPANIES OF INTEREST:

WSR's "Companies of Interest" section of its *Daily Notes* publication provides emerging growth company investors with fresh ideas. While we have only briefly reviewed these companies, something caught our attention and in our opinion the company warrants further inspection. Some of our biggest gainers have gone up over 1,000% in less than 12-months.

American Capital Agency Corp. (AGNC:NASDAQ) 2/9/10 \$27.22

The company operates as a real estate investment trust. Sales were up 152% and earnings were up 145% over the same period last year (as reported in the most recent quarter), trading at 3.71 times trailing earnings, 4.11 times sales, 1.22 times book, \$5.36 per share in cash, \$526 million market cap., \$3.39 billion enterprise value.

Diodes Incorporated (DIOD:NASDAQ) 2/10/10 \$17.89

The company together with its subsidiaries, engage in the manufacture and distribution of semiconductor products to manufacturers in the communications, computing, consumer electronics, industrial, and automotive markets worldwide. Sales were up 50% and earnings were up 227% over the same period last year (as reported in the most recent quarter), trading at 59.04 times trailing earnings, 14.66 times forward earnings, 0.86 PEG ratio, 2.00 times sales, 1.85 times book, \$10.04 per share in cash, \$780 million market cap., \$679 million enterprise value.

Amerigon Inc. (ARGN:NASDAQ) 2/11/10 \$8.91

The company designs, develops, and markets electronic components and systems for sale to car and truck original equipment manufacturers in the United States and internationally. Sales were up 68% and earnings were up 500% over the same period last year (as reported in the most recent quarter), trading at 28.74 times forward earnings, 1.71 PEG ratio, 3.67 times sales, 4.12 times book, \$1.16 per share in cash, \$191 million market cap., \$166 million enterprise value.

Grand Canyon Education, Inc. (LOPE:NASDAQ) 2/19/10 \$21.05

The company provides online postsecondary education services in the United States. Sales were up 53% and earnings were up 550% over the same period last year (as reported in the most recent quarter), trading at 50.00 times trailing earnings, 13.24 times forward earnings, 0.57 PEG ratio, 4.07 times sales, 13.07 times book, \$1.62 per share in cash, \$960 million market cap., \$916 million enterprise value.

Green Plains Renewable Energy, Inc. (GPRE:NASDAQ) 2/23/10 \$16.99

The company engages in the production, distribution, and marketing of ethanol and related by-products in the United States. Sales were up 138% and earnings were up 2,175% over the same period last year (as reported in the most recent quarter), trading at 6.48 times forward earnings, 0.40 times sales, 1.53 times book, \$3.22 per share in cash, \$424 million market cap., \$801 million enterprise value.

STEC, Inc. (STEC:NASDAQ) 2/24/10 \$13.42

The company designs, develops, manufactures, and markets custom memory solutions based on flash memory and dynamic random access memory (DRAM) technologies. Sales were up 86% and earnings were up 920% over the same period last year (as reported in the most recent quarter), trading at 14.57 times trailing earnings, 6.88 times forward earnings, 0.44 PEG ratio, 2.21 times sales, 2.69 times book, \$2.65 per share in cash, \$675 million market cap., \$541 million enterprise value.

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American Equity Investment Life Holding Co. (AEL:NYSE) 2/25/10 \$7.91

The company engages in the development and sale of annuities and life insurance products in the United States and the District of Columbia. Sales were up 323% and earnings were up 71% over the same period last year (as reported in the most recent quarter), trading at 31.77 times trailing earnings, 4.32 times forward earnings, 13.94 PEG ratio, 0.52 times sales, 0.61 times book, \$10.65 per share in cash, \$461 million market cap., \$806 million enterprise value.

interCLICK, Inc. (ICLK:NASDAQ) 2/25/10 \$4.30

The company provides Internet advertising solutions for Internet publishers and advertisers in the United States. Sales were up 158% and earnings were up 67% over the same period last year (as reported in the most recent quarter), trading at 26.88 times forward earnings, 2.12 times sales, 7.18 times book, \$0.09 per share in cash, \$89 million market cap., \$93 million enterprise value.

Par Pharmaceutical Companies Inc. (PRX:NYSE) 2/25/10 \$25.50

The company develops, manufactures, and distributes generic and branded pharmaceuticals drugs in the United States. Sales were up 80% and earnings were up 210% over the same period last year (as reported in the most recent quarter), trading at 22.83 times trailing earnings, 10.45 times forward earnings, 0.28 PEG ratio, 0.83 times sales, 1.77 times book, \$6.04 per share in cash, \$888 million market cap., \$752 million enterprise value.

ViroPharma Inc. (VPHM:NASDAQ) 2/25/10 \$11.63

The company a biopharmaceutical company, engages in the development and commercialization of products that address serious diseases with a focus on products used by physician specialists or in hospital settings in the United States and internationally. Sales were up 76% and earnings were up 286% over the same period last year (as reported in the most recent quarter), trading at 38.77 times forward earnings, 2.18 PEG ratio, 3.30 times sales, 1.22 times book, \$3.73 per share in cash, \$901 million market cap., \$748 million enterprise value.
